## Seed, Sower, and Soil

The parable of the sower in today's gospel is a multidimensional parable. So to fully appreciate this parable we need to view it from different perspectives. Too often we focus only on the soil on which the seed landed. That is a good message which challenges us to open our hardened hearts to the word of God that we may be more fruitful. But there is more to this parable.



If we focus on the sower, we gain an insight into the generosity of God who sows good seed not only on fertile soil, but also on less productive, even hostile ground. God makes poor investments in unworthy causes. He is willing to offer his grace even to rebellious hearts. In simple terms, God is a poor farmer, but a good Father.

Again, if we look at the parable from the perspective of the seed we learn the power of the word of God. Even in unfavorable circumstances the seed manages to take root and bear some fruit. The parable then makes clear that the faults of Christians are not a failure of the word of God.

Chesterton observed, "The Christian ideal has not been tried and found wanting. It has been found difficult, and left untried."

This enduring power of the seed offers hope to all who must teach the message of the gospel, including parents training their children. The words of instruction and the deeds of good example you sow, despite lack of apparent success, may still bear abundant fruit. God works wonders with the less than wonderful.

Finally, if we view the parable from the point of the harvest we find another message of hope. Harvests of thirty, sixty, or one hundred fold were unheard of in the agriculture of biblical times. The word of God produces fruit not only greater than our expectations, but in ways that we never expected. Our efforts are often rewarded with harvests rich in unexpected ways, in love and joy and peace. This parable reveals the generosity of God's grace.

The harvest is also an image of the second coming of Christ and the final judgement. The effect of the word of God in our world and in our own life will be fully known only on that final day. The hidden goodness of many faithful people will be richly rewarded in the age to come. This parable of the sower of the seed, seen in all its dimensions, is a message of enduring hope. Mighty oaks from tiny acorns grow.

## Fort Hays State University Looking for Host Families for German Students

CBYX is a program of the U.S. Department of State and implemented by Cultural Vistas. German students who have already completed an apprenticeship in their field in Germany are personally selected by a German Member of Parliament to be a citizen ambassador to the U.S.A. Students are 18-24 years old and come from varied backgrounds and fields across Germany. Students receive a Fellowship from the United States Department of State to study and work in the United States for one year.

Hosts can be families, single adults, empty nesters, or young couples. They provide two meals per day and a private bedroom. Host families receive a monthly stipend of \$225 for the duration of the stay.
