The Prayer Book of the Bible

There is a key verse in today's gospel. When the risen Christ appeared to his apostles he explained the meaning of his death and resurrection: "Everything written about me in the law of Moses and in the prophets and in the *psalms* must be fulfilled." (Lk 14:45) The *psalms* help us to understand the life and death of Christ.

The psalms are Semitic poetry, which is different from our poetry and require some background to be appreciated. The literary technique of the psalms is *parallelism*, a *rhyming* of ideas. It is a way of delving deeper into a concept by looking at it from more than one perspective, from different angles.

The basic theme of the psalms is praising God, and rabbis refer to the psalms as the Book of Praises. There are different types of psalms: messianic, penitential, historical, etc. This wide variety offers a richness in prayer. There is a fitting psalm for every occasion. If you want to cry, there is a psalm; if you want to complain, there is a psalm; and if you want to rejoice, there are many psalms.

The significance of the psalms as prayer is evident in our liturgy. The book of psalms is the only book of the Bible from which we read at every Mass. Yes, there is a gospel reading at Mass, but from one of four gospels. At every Mass we pray a *Responsorial Psalm*, which is enhanced when it is sung. The word *psalm* is taken from

the Greek word meaning *song*.

The forcefulness of the psalms can be startling. Their vocabulary is often blunt, even challenging

God. The psalms enter into the dynamic of faith and doubt. In the other books of the Bible,

God speaks to us; in the psalms we speak to God, and He speaks back to us. They are dynamic prayers.

St. Ambrose said, "The psalms are the gymnasium of the soul."

The poet laureate John Donne wrote, "The psalms foretell what we shall do and suffer and say." Dorothy Day said, "My strength returns to me with a cup of coffee and the praying of the psalms." C.S. Lewis wrote, "The most valuable thing the psalms do for me is to express the same delight in God which made David dance."

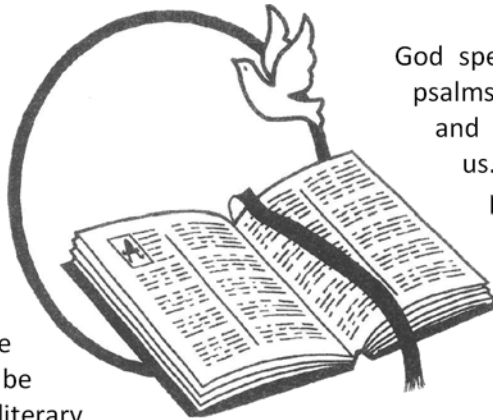

SUNDAY AND HOLY DAY MASS OBLIGATION

The dispensation given for all Catholics from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass will remain in effect until it is safe to lift it. The dispensation from Sunday Mass obligation continues because the Church does not want to place a moral burden on those who should not attend Sunday Mass because of age or health conditions.

However, Catholics are still obliged to keep the Commandments, including the Commandment to keep holy the Lord's Day. Families who choose not to attend Mass should conduct a Liturgy of the Word in the home. Individuals and families should spend additional time in prayer, pious devotions, and spiritual reading on Sunday. Younger adults who are least at risk from the virus should take advantage of the opportunity to participate in person at Mass and to receive Holy Communion if they are properly disposed. If those in good health are attending other large social gatherings, they should also be participating at the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass on Sundays.

For those attending Mass on Sundays and Holy Days, we expect to continue social distancing and the wearing of masks in church.
