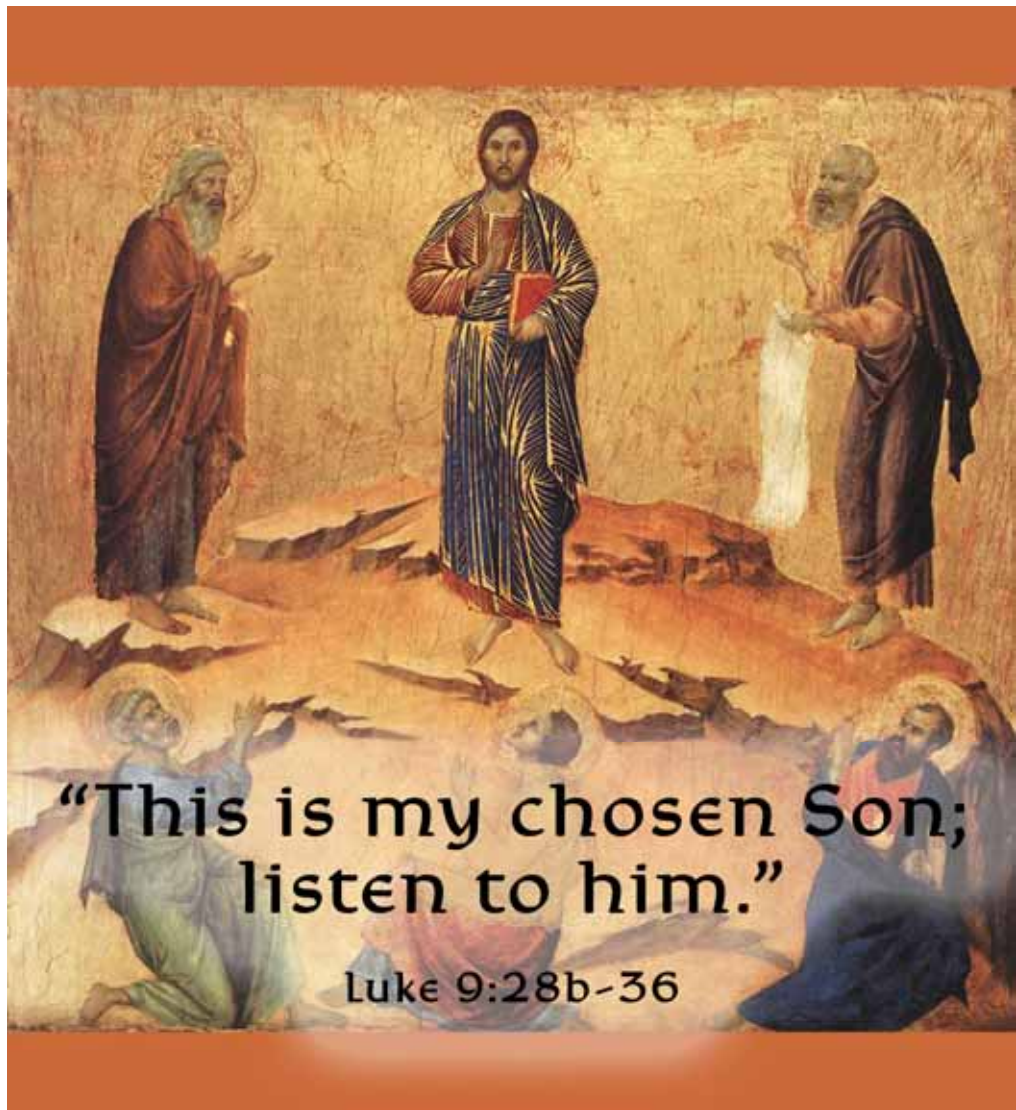

A Lenten Transfiguration

The gospel for the first Sunday of Lent is always the story of Satan tempting Christ, which is an obvious Lenten topic. The gospel for the second Sunday of Lent is always the Transfiguration, and that Lenten message is not apparent.

Today we read the account of the Transfiguration from the gospel of Luke which includes details not in the other gospels. Those details help to clarify the Lenten message of the Transfiguration.



The gospels of Matthew and Mark say that Jesus led Peter, James, and John up a high mountain and was transfigured before them. Luke says, "Jesus took them up the mountain to pray, and while he was praying he was changed in appearance." Luke sees the Transfiguration as a union with God achieved through prayer.

Matthew and Mark say that Jesus was transfigured. Luke says, "His face changed in appearance and his clothes became dazzling white." For Luke this outward appearance reflects the inner union with God achieved in prayer.

Only Luke mentions that the disciples Peter, James, and John were asleep. These same three also slept during the agony in the garden of Gethsemane. With these sleeping apostles Luke ties the glory of the

Transfiguration with the passion of Christ. The garden of Gethsemane is related to the mount of the Transfiguration as the agony of the passion is to the glory of the Resurrection. As Lent is to Easter.

The most significant detail in Luke's account is that only he tells us what Jesus, Moses, and Elijah were talking about: "the exodus that he was going to accomplish in Jerusalem." This exodus of Christ recalls the exodus of the Hebrews from the slavery of Egypt,

through the travails of the desert, into the promised land. As that exodus from Egypt freed the Hebrews from slavery, the exodus of Christ, his death and resurrection, freed us from the bonds of sin.

The Preface of today's Mass also refers to this dimension of the Transfiguration. "Christ revealed Himself in glory to His disciples to prepare them for His approaching death. He

wanted to teach them through the law and the Prophets that the promised Christ had first to suffer and so come to the glory of His resurrection."

Luke's account of the Transfiguration emphasizes the core theme of Lent: the passion, death, and resurrection of Christ. As we struggle with our weaknesses to emerge as better Christians, this message of today's gospel, connecting the passion of Christ with his resurrection, offers hope that our Lenten observance will lead to a share in his eternal glory.

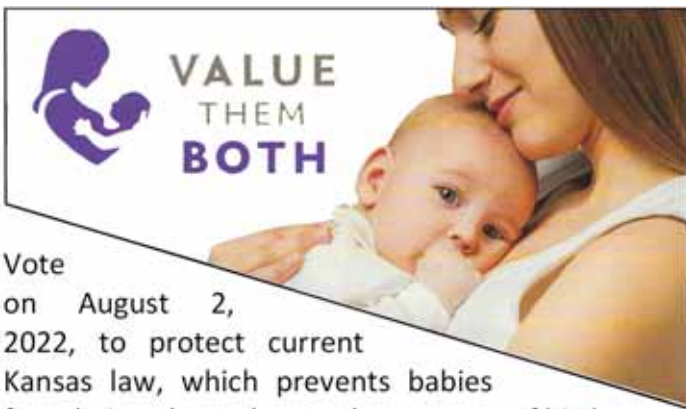
Rosary for Pro-Life & Value Them Both

The Worldwide Synod — March Meeting at St. Nick's in Hays

The first phase of the two-year synod called by Pope Francis is happening in local dioceses throughout the world. The goal of the synod is to become a more “listening” Church. A listening session will be held in **Hays at St. Nicholas Parish Pall on Sunday, March 20, at 3:00 p.m.** Anyone is invited to participate.

The entire Catholic Church is called to participate in the upcoming Synod of Bishops. This synod is entitled: “For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, and Mission.” Pope Francis has called the entire People of God to journey together. This synod is not just another meeting with oral presentations and written reports. This synod is a process of journeying together by listening, dialoguing, praying, discerning, and making decisions together for the purpose of proclaiming the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

Pope Francis is asking each local diocese to gather—clergy, religious, and laity together—to listen to each other. The goal of this journeying together is not to create a new vision or pastoral plan with objectives. Rather, the goal of our journeying together is to be present with one another, to listen and learn with each other, and to grow closer to the Lord and His Church.

“This synod offers us the opportunity to be with each other, to invite our family and friends back to the faith, to listen to each other’s joys and sorrows, and share our hope and dreams for our parishes.” ~Cardinal Wilton Gregory

Synod is a Greek word; *synodos* means a meeting or assembly. The two Greek words that make up synod are *syn*, meaning together, and *hodos*, meaning way or journey.

Vatican II pointed out that the Church is not the Kingdom but it is the People of God accompanying one another on the pilgrimage to the Kingdom. Synodality is a periodic assessment, not of the progress toward the Kingdom, but of our accompanying one another.

Synod listening sessions will be held in seven locations within the diocese: Manhattan, Salina, Hays, Colby, Norton, Tipton, and Belleville.

The questions for discussion will be the following.

1. What brings you joy in your local parish or in the larger Church right now?
2. What brings you sadness about the Church?
3. Where do you see the Spirit leading the Church?

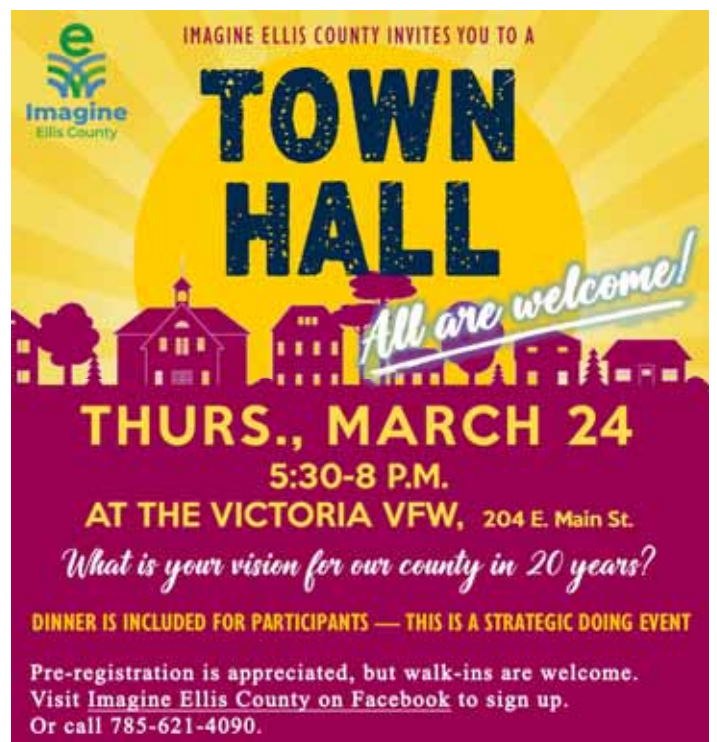
