

The Real Presence of Christ

A recent survey revealed that a disturbing number of Catholics do not believe what the church teaches about the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist, but see it only as a symbolic reminder of his life and death.

Today's feast of the Body and Blood of the Lord, is a fitting occasion to review the teaching of the church on the Eucharistic presence of Christ. The historical Jesus of Nazareth physically present in the Eucharist is contrary to authentic Catholic faith. It is the risen Christ, now living eternally with the Father, who is present in the Eucharist.



The risen Christ appeared to his disciples in various forms with properties that were not constrained by this physical world. Pope Benedict XVI described the body of the risen Christ as "a different dimension of human existence." The bodily presence of Christ in the Eucharist is not a physical body but his risen body.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church states, "In the Blessed Sacrament, the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ is truly, really, and

substantially contained. This presence is called 'real' because it is presence in the fullest sense. It is a substantial presence by which Christ—God and man—makes himself wholly and entirely present.

"It is by the conversion of the bread and wine into Christ's body and blood that Christ becomes present in this sacrament. The Church Fathers strongly affirmed the faith of the Church in the power of the Words of Christ and of the action of the Holy Spirit to bring about this conversion. St. John Chrysostom declared: 'It is not man that causes the things offered to become the Body and Blood of Christ, but our Savior himself.'"

The Council of Trent taught: "Because Christ our Redeemer said that it was truly his body that he was offering under the species of bread, it has always been the conviction of the Church, that by the consecration of the bread and wine there takes place a change of the whole substance of the bread into the substance of the body of Christ our Lord and of the whole substance of the wine into the substance of his blood. This change the Catholic Church has fittingly called transubstantiation."

The Eucharist is *the source and summit of the Christian life*. The other sacraments, and indeed all the ministries of the church and works of the apostolate, are bound up with the Eucharist and are oriented toward it. For the Eucharist contains the whole spiritual good of the Church, namely Christ himself.

Cool Kingdom Party Vacation Bible School

From June 6 through 10, 55 children in grades pre-K through 4th grade, and over 25 volunteers of all ages gathered, played, prayed, and brought to life the Cool Kingdom Party Vacation Bible School (VBS) created by Cat.Chat productions. The children learned through activities, prayer, and songs about their Heavenly Mother, Mary, and how she leads each of us closer to Jesus through her loving intercession and prayers.

On Monday morning, little voices and feet came running up the usually quiet stairwell of the Victoria St. Fidelis Friary. At the opening assembly, Father Jim Moster kicked off the VBS with a prayer and pulled out of the treasure chest a scroll with the word “Yes”, emphasizing the importance of Mary’s “Yes, Lord!” and obedience to God’s will. At the faith station with Mrs. Shirley Brungardt, each child wrote a special intention down on a rose to offer to Mama Mary. They learned more about the virtue of obedience through skits, songs, and audio dramas. At crafts with Mrs. Connie Braun, they created their own Rosary Hanger to go on their wall at home. At games with Mrs. Jeanna Wellbrock, roses were brought to Mary, and children played the “Hail Mary Hunt”, a scavenger hunt with the words to the Hail Mary prayer. At snacks with Mrs. Andrea Hoffman, the children created Edible Roses for Mary. The music, which is all Cat.Chat original songs, was delightful especially for our younger children as they danced and sang to “Yes, Lord”, a Cat.Chat original. They sang along and danced to the lyrics: “I wanna say Yes! Just like Mary said, I wanna say Yes!... doing God’s will in the little things like listening and obeying with a joyful heart.” And this was all just on Monday within a brief 3-hour window of time. By Friday, the week was filled with moments that were full of awe and wonder at God’s goodness and love for each of us: the adults, youth, and children participating.

Jennifer Anderson, who helped lead the pre-K and K group, stated: *“The CatChat curriculum is awesome and is very engaging for our bigs and littles. We love this week and love seeing Jesus work through us all to help share our faith with our growing youth!”* Christie Sander, a 3rd and 4th grade group leader, echoed many of these same sentiments and stated *“Cat.Chat is very easy to follow. The students love the music and dancing and almost all the activities keep their attention. The adult and student volunteers are amazing!”* YES, our youth are amazing!!! Nearly all who return to help have participated in the VBS in the years before and are the absolute best!! Connie Braun, the crafts station leader, stated *“I loved how all the volunteers worked together to help the youth deepen their faith. It felt like family.”*

Our children most importantly are a living testimony to the love of our Heavenly Father. At the faith station on Thursday, the 2nd graders were asked, “How is Jesus a good King?” Devyn Hunter, an upcoming 3rd grader answered, “He doesn’t command.” At this same setting, the children were asked, “What is the ultimate reward for obedience to God’s will?” Maverick Scherrer, another upcoming 3rd grader, answered with “Freedom.” Wow! Two very profound answers were given that unveiled what we have all hoped to impart on our children: our faith is more than a set of laws and commands; ultimately it is LOVE which drives God to desire our obedience. And what is Heaven? Absolute freedom—freedom from sin, from pain, from death... out of the mouths of babes God spoke to me as I sat there in awe of these two very profound truths, shared by the children.
