



The Faith of the Doubting Thomas

Today's gospel of the doubting Thomas raises some challenging questions. And they are pertinent to the practice of our faith today. Why was Thomas not with the others when the Lord first appeared to them? Had he given up? If so, he surprisingly returned and made the boldest profession of faith of all the apostles, "My Lord and my God." He may represent disenchanting Catholics who stop attending church, but then return after resolving their doubt. Often they have a deeper conviction than cradle Catholics.



Why did the Lord wait a week to reappear with Thomas present? Perhaps Christ was allowing Thomas time to work through his struggle with faith. We are not all ready at any moment to make a profession of faith. The circumstances of life and opportunities for faith development affect one's ability to make a serious commitment. Not all the workers in the vineyard began at the first hour, yet all received the same reward.

Was the boast of the others, "We have seen the Lord," a taunt implying they were better apostles than Thomas? The manner in which we profess our faith affects others. We can edify or shame. It takes prudence to challenge others without offending. Good example must be given in a good manner.

Why is the doubting Thomas honored as a saint? Is doubt now a virtue? Doubt may not be a virtue in and of itself, but doubt is an essential part of an authentic faith. St. Philip Neri wrote, "Our faith owes more to the doubts of Thomas than to the belief of all the other Apostles." That is an important observation for our secular culture.

Our doubts must be faced and engaged if our faith is to grow. An unexamined faith is not an authentic faith. A thousand doubts do not make a single denial. The doubting Thomas is offered as a model for all who raise honest questions from the perspective of a sincere faith. It is significant that Thomas doubted. It is more important that ultimately he believed.

The words of Christ, "Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed" can be taken as a rebuke of Thomas. Or they may be a subtle blessing of

Thomas who had not seen the first appearance with the other apostles yet had come to believe. Perhaps Christ is blessing not so much those who have never doubted, but more so those whose struggle with faith has led them to the deeper faith of Thomas, "My Lord and my God."

April Is Child Abuse Prevention Month

Did you know... Child abuse can occur in every culture and every socio-economic demographic. Peer reviewed research, especially that of the past 30 years, repeatedly shows this to be true. This same research indicates that the vast majority of child abuse occurs at the hands of someone known to the victim. Those who seek to do harm to children will pursue opportunities that provide access to children and may even ingratiate themselves into the home. You can protect children by respecting the safe environment protocols established at youth-serving organizations. More importantly, you can implement many of these protocols in your home and be ever observant and vigilant in all public and private settings.

SAFE ENVIRONMENT PROGRAM



DIocese OF SALINA

All those who minister to children or young people on a regular basis are to be educated about the nature of child sexual abuse, how to report it, and strategies for prevention.

The Diocese of Salina currently uses a program called CMGCONNECT, a web-based, on-line training program (along with an integrated background check) that specializes in helping churches, schools, and religious organizations create safe environments for children and youth. High School students in grades 9-12 who work with other minors on a regular basis will do their own training through CMGConnect, which covers safe and appropriate ways to interact with other children.

BEFORE beginning any ministry with children in your parish or school, you must have Safe Environment Training and it must be current (taken within the last 5 years).

Hearing Assists Available for Use During Mass in The Basilica

St. Fidelis has wireless hearing assists with adjustable volume that connect directly to the church's sound system.

If you are interested in trying one, come by the Parish Office, pay a small deposit, and keep your unit until you don't need it. We will refund your deposit once the unit is returned.

If you already have personal bluetooth hearing aids that are controllable from your cell phone, you can download an app on your cell and hear in church through your hearing aids.

Just download the WaveCAST Audio Receiver app by Williams Sound LLC from the Apple App Store on i-phones or from Google Play or Play Store on android phones.

While in church when the sound system is turned on, click the WaveCAST icon and select the church's "HearingAid" wi-fi option to connect to the system. The password is also "hearingaid".

You will then control the volume, etc. from your individual hearing aid program already on your phone.
