Saint Francis of Assisi

“The spirit in which we should turn to St. Francis is the spirit of thanks for what he has done. He was above all things a great giver; and he cared chiefly for the best of giving which is called thanksgiving.

“If another great man (Cardinal Newman) wrote the *Grammar of Assent*, he may well be said to have written the *Grammar of Gratitude*. He understood down to its very depths the theory of thanks, and its depths are a bottomless abyss. He knew that the praise of God stands on its firmest ground when it stands on nothing. He knew that we can best measure the towering miracle of our mere existence if we realize that, but for some strange mercy, we should not even exist.

“St. Francis walked the world like the Pardon of God. His appearance marked the moment when all people could be reconciled not only to God, but to nature and, most difficult of all, to themselves. It marked the moment when all the stale paganism that had poisoned the ancient world was at last worked out of the social system. He opened the gates of the Dark Ages, as of a prison of purgatory, and men could cleanse themselves of barbarian wars. It was his whole function to tell men and women to start afresh.

“From him came a whole new awakening of the world and a dawn in which all shapes and colors could

be seen anew. The mighty men of genius who made the great Christian civilization that we have inherited appear in history almost as his servants and imitators. Before Dante was, he gave poetry to Italy; before St. Louis ruled, he had risen as a tribute to the poor; and before Giotto had painted the pictures, he had created the scenes.

“He was the spiritual essence and substance that walked the world before anyone had seen these things in their visible forms that derived from it; a wandering fire, as if from nowhere, at which people more material could light both torches and tapers. He was the soul of medieval civilization before it even found a body. His ardor for human life was against the pride and cruelty of riches.

“Neither on the side of the artistic nor the social side would anyone pretend that these things would have existed without him. Yet, it is strictly true to say that we cannot imagine them without him, the saint who by living the gospel changed the world.”

SAFE ENVIRONMENT PROGRAM



DIOCESE OF SALINA

All those who minister to children or young people on a regular basis are to be educated about the nature of child sexual abuse, how to report it, and strategies for prevention.

The Diocese of Salina currently uses a program called CMGCONNECT, a web-based, on-line training program (along with an integrated background check) that specializes in helping churches, schools, and religious organizations create safe environments for children and youth. High School students in grades 9-12 who work with other minors on a regular basis will do their own training through CMGConnect, which covers safe and appropriate ways to interact with other children.

BEFORE beginning any ministry with children in your parish or school, you must have Safe Environment Training and it must be current (taken within the last 5 years).

DIOCESAN ANNIVERSARY MASS TO BE CELEBRATED LOCALLY

Plans for the Anniversary Masses scheduled for October 18 in Hays and October 25 in Salina have been altered due to the pandemic. We will still recognize couples celebrating their 1st anniversary and all anniversaries ending in 0 or 5 this calendar year with each couple being recognized in their home parish at a regularly scheduled Mass the weekend of October 24-25.

Each couple will receive a certificate from the diocese recognizing them for being witnesses of faith through the Sacrament of Marriage.

It is still necessary for couples to register for the event and they can **register online at the diocesan website** (salinadiocese.org/family-life) **or mail in a registration form** (available at the Parish Office) **before the deadline of Friday, October 16**. Once registrations have been received, parishes will be notified with the names of the couples being recognized and the number of years they have been married. Couples have the option to NOT attend Mass but will still be recognized.

2021 March of Life Will Be Different

The 2021 March for Life in Washington, D.C. will take place January 29, 2021. There will be a Salina Diocese sponsored pilgrimage again in 2021 but it will look different than past years. With uncertainty caused by the pandemic it was decided to NOT charter busses for the 25+ hour trip because confining a large group of people in a bus is not advisable at this time.

The alternative to riding the bus is to fly to D.C. or drive yourself there! Airline tickets are currently priced at an affordable rate, but that will change quickly as the January event date draws closer. The Diocese WILL NOT purchase airline tickets, that is up to each individual or group to do on their own. The Diocese WILL provide hotel accommodations and transportation in D.C.!

The itinerary will look very different this year as well. Many of the activities such as the evening rallies and Mass with the other dioceses of Kansas are unlikely to happen. The pilgrimage will focus on the March itself and will still include a visit to the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception, but other activities will be limited.

Plan on making travel arrangements to arrive in D.C. late afternoon/evening on Thursday, January 28, and depart from Reagan National Airport after 2:00 p.m. on Saturday, January 30.

Expected cost per person for hotel and transportation in D.C. is \$200. The DEADLINE to register is NOVEMBER 20, 2020 with two ways to register. Online registration is available, or you can mail in your registration. Full payment of \$200 is due with your registration. Make checks payable to Salina Diocese Respect Life Office and mailed to PO Box 980, Salina, KS 67402, attention: March for Life. Cost of travel must be paid by the individual. Registration forms, Medical/Waiver forms, are available on the diocesan Website.
