A Great Millstone

"Whoever causes one of these little ones who believes in me to sin, it would be better for him if a great millstone were put around his neck and he were thrown into the sea." (Mk 9:42)

That verse from today's gospel is one of the most ominous warnings of Christ. It is a teaching of our faith not shared by the popular culture: we are responsible not only for our own conduct but we are held accountable also for the effect it has on others, especially the young and the vulnerable.

The standard of much of our secular world is: "I do my thing and you do your thing, and the devil be darned." It is a false freedom unburdened with responsibility. It is very appealing and self-affirming. And it is wrong. Christianity, in bold contrast, offers a community faith. St. Augustine put it simply, "One Christian is no Christian." Our personal faith is shared. We pray and worship together, giving and gaining strength to and from others. We are to offer good example, and not be misled by bad example.

This tension between individual freedom and community responsibility arises early in the human family. The murderous Cain professed total freedom, "Am I my brother's keeper?" The answer is, "Yes, you are the keeper of his humanity, his dignity, his rights; but not the keeper of his possessions, his privacy, or his conscience."

There is a

fine line between charity and meddling, concern and coercion, helping and hindering. In practice this requires both prudence and patience.

Our tradition teaches the power of good example in the honor we bestow on the great saints. They inspire us by their heroic virtues; they embody the values that are central to our faith. There is an important distinction here between the attention given to pop stars and the admiration of the saints. It is the difference between admiring greatness and honoring goodness. As Mother Teresa said, "I was not called to be successful; I was called to be faithful."

We are neither to give nor to be misled by the bad example of another. This requires recognizing morally wrong behavior, yet not judging the conscience of others. Without being judgmental, we are to discern what is or is not virtuous in the conduct of others. Not to engage in gossip, but to seek guidance. "Whoever causes one

of these little ones who believe in me to sin; it would be better for him if a great millstone were put around his neck and he were thrown into the sea."

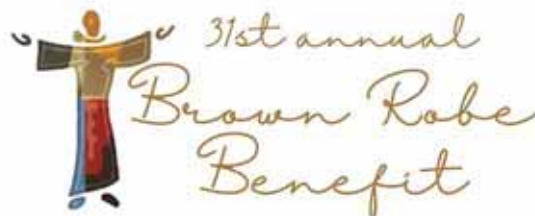
