## The Temples of Our Lives

The story of Christ driving the merchants from the temple is in all four gospels. Today we read from the gospel of John which has the most severe account of that incident. Jesus made a whip of cords to drive out the animals and spilled the coins of the money changers. These vivid details are not in the other gospel narratives. John also places this event at the beginning of the public life of Christ, while the other gospels place it early in Holy Week.

Why is John's account different? John places the story at the beginning of the public life of Christ to establish the opposition that will occur throughout his gospel between the Jewish leaders and Jesus. The other gospels also recount this struggle but not as often or as severely as John. The temple, as the center of the religious life of the people, is symbolic of the gravity of their differences. A fundamental choice is coming.

This opposition comes to a crisis when, after Christ drives the merchants from the temple, the Jewish leaders demand, "What sign can you show us for doing this?" To which Jesus replied, "Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up." There is a new temple coming, which is the risen body of Christ and also the church as the body of Christ.

The temple in John's gospel, therefore, represents the very core of his message: that temple will be replaced by a new temple, the body of Christ, which will rise triumphant to establish the church of his faithful who will be temples of the Holy Spirit. St. Paul wrote, "Do you not know that you

are the temple of God, and that the Spirit of God dwells in you? If anyone destroys God's temple, God will destroy that person; for the temple of



God, which you are, is holy."(1Cor 3:16) Baptism made us temples of the Holy Spirit. As all blessings, it comes with responsibilities. We must live as we profess.

In today's gospel Christ drove the merchants from the temple because they had desecrated that sacred place. The temple of our body can be made an unfit dwelling place for the Holy Spirit by lives contrary to our faith. Lent is a time for us to cleanse our temples of what is unworthy of a follower of Christ that we may devoutly worship in his church, the new temple of the risen Christ.

## PASTOR'S CORNER

### CONSECRATED CHURCH

During the process of redecorating the interior of St. Fidelis Basilica, someone came forward with a question about what is the meaning of the twelve small wooden crosses and candle holders placed around the walls of the church. The answer is that our church is specially consecrated by the bishop.

Consecration, in general, is an act by which a thing is separated from a common and profane to a sacred use, or by which a person or thing is dedicated to the service and worship of God by prayers, rites, and ceremonies.

On May 25, 1986, Bishop George K. Fitzsimmons of the Salina Diocese, set aside for Divine Worship, by special act of consecration and dedication, the new marble altar and church building itself for perpetual and exclusive use for worship. The altar and walls were anointed with chrism in twelve places, which were marked by the crosses. That was also the 75th anniversary of the present building. Fr. Gilmary Tallman, O.F.M.Cap. was pastor.

Those twelve candles may be lit for special worship celebrations. We hope to use them for this Easter.

In 2014, St. Fidelis Church was also designated as a Basilica by Pope Francis. In the Brief of Erection the Pope declares:

"We, by our apostolic authority . . . erect St. Fidelis Church to the dignity of a basilica and bestow upon it all the privileges which belong to the lesser basilicas of this our own cherished city (Rome)."

## SUNDAY AND HOLY DAY MASS OBLIGATION

The dispensation given for all Catholics from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass will remain in effect until it is safe to lift it. The dispensation from Sunday Mass obligation continues because the Church does not want to place a moral burden on those who should not attend Sunday Mass because of age or health conditions.

**However, Catholics are still obliged to keep the Commandments, including the Commandment to keep holy the Lord's Day.** Families who choose not to attend Mass should conduct a Liturgy of the Word in the home. Individuals and families should spend additional time in prayer, pious devotions, and spiritual reading on Sunday. Younger adults who are least at risk from the virus should take advantage of the opportunity to participate in person at Mass and to receive Holy Communion if they are properly disposed. If those in good health are attending other large social gatherings, they should also be participating at the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass on Sundays.

**For those attending Mass on Sundays and Holy Days, we expect to continue social distancing and the wearing of masks in church.**

## Quick Church Clean-up

The scaffolding in the church should come down after Palm Sunday.

When that happens, the pews and floor will need cleaning. Because that will be Holy Week, we will simply dust and vacuum so the pews are clean for Holy Week services.
