The Good Sinner

Sports fans know flamboyant athletes who justify their boasting, "If you can do it, it ain't bragging." Yet most prefer those of quiet talent who admit their errors and apologize for their mistakes. They are images of the pharisee and tax collector in today's gospel.

We find the Pharisee in this gospel repulsive and the tax collector



comforting. Yet the contrast of the two is not that simplistic. The Pharisee was the most observant of all the Jews and did as he boasted. He was saying, "If you can do it, it ain't bragging." He fasted from all food and all drink two days of every week. He gave ten percent of his income to the temple. Few Christians do half as well observing their faith.

The tax collectors, by contrast, were collaborators with the occupying and oppressive Roman government. They overtaxed the working people and kept the excess amount for themselves. The tax collector was a professional thief, a white collar crook. Today such financial embezzlers go to prison — if they get caught.

The Pharisee was a hard-working,

church-going, pillar of the community. The tax collector was a thief, a thug, and a cheat. Yet in this parable, the tax collector is the good guy and the Pharisee is the bad guy. What are we to make of this?

This story does not condemn the Pharisee for being religious. It condemns him for being self-righteous. The parable does not praise the tax collector for cheating. It praises his repentance. The Pharisee trusted in himself. The tax collector trusted in God.

Notice the wording: "The Pharisee spoke his prayer *to himself*." The Pharisee did not praise God, but congratulated himself. He asks nothing from God, because he thinks he needs nothing from God. He is his own salvation. The tax collector, by contrast, prayed to God. His simple plea for mercy focuses on God. He admits that he is a sinner and knows that he cannot save himself. Only

God can do that.

There was good and bad in both the Pharisee and the tax collector. Our challenge is to discern the good from the bad. When Saint Francis saw a lost soul, a public sinner, an arrogant criminal, he would say, "There, but for the grace of God, go I." St. Francis knew that the goodness in his life was from God, and that his sins were his own.

Smug athletes often strut and claim, "If you can do it, it ain't bragging." The Gospel says, "If you can do it, praise God."
