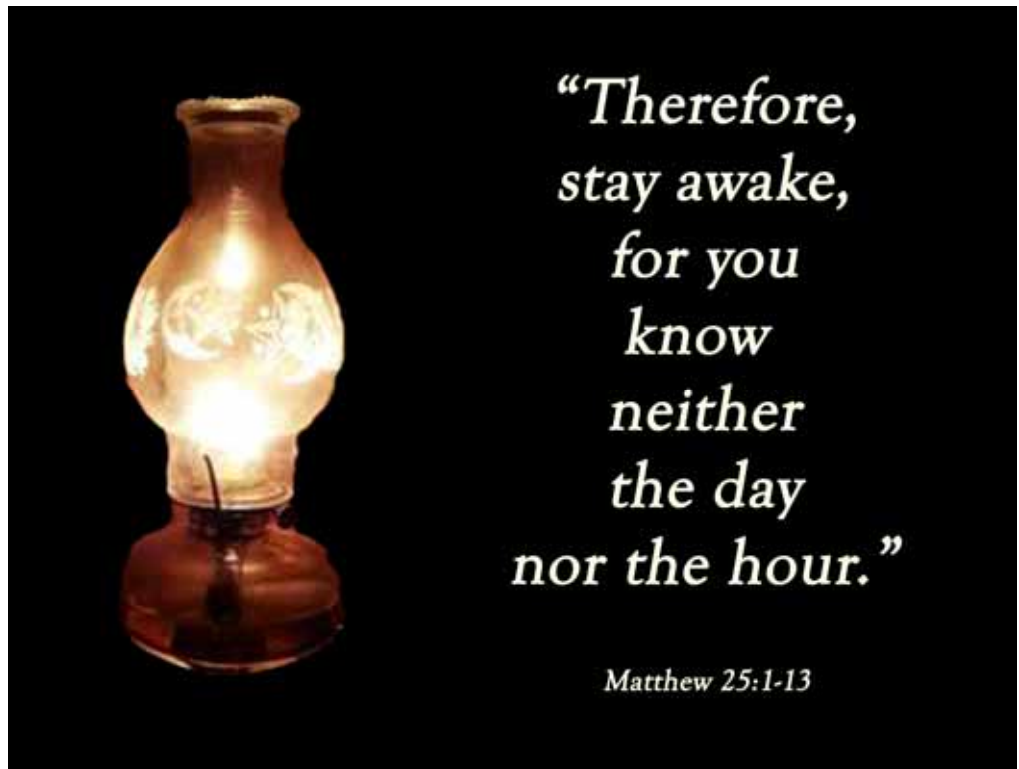

The Rude Groomsmen

Women hear gospel stories quite differently than men. And today's parable is a good example. This gospel passage is traditionally referred to as the Parable of the Foolish Bridesmaids.

That title comes from the



early *fathers* of the church. They saw the failure of the bridesmaids to provide sufficient oil as a lack of prudence and foresight. And there is a valuable lesson in that interpretation.

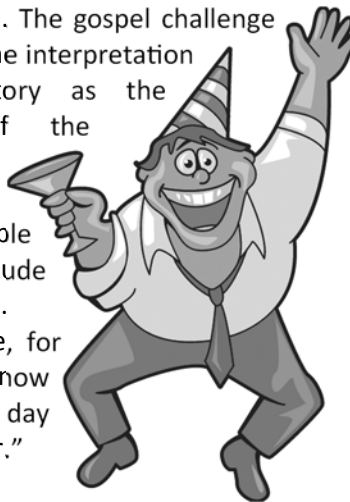
But women scripture scholars see the story from a quite different perspective. The five bridesmaids were not irresponsible. They were the victims of the rude and inconsiderate behavior of the bridegroom and his party. The reason the women did not have enough oil for their lamps was not their lack of prudent planning, but the irresponsible behavior of the men. If the groomsmen had not been out all night carousing with their buddies and then returned late there would have been plenty of oil in the bridesmaids' lamps.

Adding injury to insult, after returning late and forcing the bridesmaids to go and buy more oil — which they caused by their irresponsible behavior — the carousing groom had the nerve to lock the door on the bridesmaids, embarrass them, and then refused them entry into the party. They are the ones who should

be embarrassed and punished, not the five bridesmaids whom they inconvenienced. So women can rightly refer to this gospel story not as the Parable of the Foolish Bridesmaids, but the Parable of the Rude Groomsmen.

The message of the gospel as the Parable of the Foolish Bridesmaids is daily fidelity to our Christian values. That is valid and should not be minimized. "Stay awake, for you know neither the day nor the hour." We need to live a Christian life day in and day out so that we are prepared to answer not only the final call of the Lord, but also the regular challenges of daily life.

But when this story is read as the Parable of the Rude Groomsmen there is a further message. We are challenged to reflect on how our behavior affects others. Our lack of responsibility can often inconvenience and embarrass those who are dependent on us. Such burdens on others might be unknown to us but we are nevertheless responsible for our carelessness. The gospel challenge applies to the interpretation of this story as the Parable of the Foolish Virgins or as the Parable of the Rude Groomsmen. "Stay awake, for you know neither the day nor the hour."

2021 March of Life Will Be Different

The 2021 March for Life in Washington, D.C. will take place January 29, 2021. There will be a Salina Diocese sponsored pilgrimage again in 2021 but it will look different than past years. With uncertainty caused by the pandemic it was decided to NOT charter busses for the 25+ hour trip because confining a large group of people in a bus is not advisable at this time.

The alternative to riding the bus is to fly to D.C. or drive yourself there! Airline tickets are currently priced at an affordable rate, but that will change quickly as the January event date draws closer. The Diocese WILL NOT purchase airline tickets, that is up to each individual or group to do on their own. The Diocese WILL provide hotel accommodations and transportation in D.C.!

The itinerary will look very different this year as well. Many of the activities such as the evening rallies and Mass with the other dioceses of Kansas are unlikely to happen. The pilgrimage will focus on the March itself and will still include a visit to the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception, but other activities will be limited.

Plan on making travel arrangements to arrive in D.C. late afternoon/evening on Thursday, January 28, and depart from Reagan National Airport after 2:00 p.m. on Saturday, January 30.

Expected cost per person for hotel and transportation in D.C. is \$200. **The DEADLINE to register is NOVEMBER 20, 2020** with two ways to register. Online registration is available, or you can mail in your registration. Full payment of \$200 is due with your registration. Make checks payable to Salina Diocese Respect Life Office and mailed to PO Box 980, Salina, KS 67402, attention: March for Life. Cost of travel must be paid by the individual. Registration forms, Medical/Waiver forms, are available on the diocesan Website.

ALL plans are subject to change as the ongoing pandemic makes it difficult to be assured of anything. When purchasing airline tickets be sure to ask about refund ability or transferring the use of your ticket to a later date in the event we don't go.
