The Grinch Who Stole Advent

One of the despised villains in Dr. Seuss is *The Grinch Who Stole Christmas.* The Grinch was "a bitter, angry creature with a heart two sizes too small." He tried to prevent

Christmas from coming by stealing all the Christmas presents and the holiday decorations. Dr. Seuss asks, "Was there ever a creature so cruel?"

Christians might answer, "Yes, the Grinch who stole Advent." This doesn't Grinch pilfer presents or destroy decorations. He encourages haste and hurry and hype. He picks the fruit before it is ripe. He steals the wonder of waiting, the longing of the heart, the magic of dreams. He robs us of that quiet anticipation to

prepare our hearts for a joyous celebration of the birth of Christ. He is busy already in the marketplace, the home place, even in some holy places.

Mothers warn children tempted to nibble before meals, "Don't spoil your appetite!" Don't spoil your spiritual appetite, that inner hunger for celebrating the birth of Our Savior. Wait. But how to wait? The Advent models of waiting for the birth of the Savior are Mary, the mother of Christ, and John the Baptist, the forerunner of Christ.



During that first Advent Mary waited in awe of the divine child within her. Yet was not

preoccupied with her own concerns, but found time for another. She went to help her cousin Elizabeth who was in need. The advent of Mary teaches us this Christian paradox: in helping another, we help ourselves; in making Christmas for others, we make Christmas for ourselves. During Advent watch as

> Mary watched, with an awe that inspired charity.

John the Baptist may be a less comforting model than Mary, but he is no less significant. John proclaimed the coming of the Lord with the same words as Christ himself, "Repent, for the kingdom of God is at hand." That is not a threat, but an opportunity. That the kingdom of God is at hand

takes on special meaning during Advent. The Lord is near to us not only in the short time remaining before Christmas, but in the spirit of this season of joy and hope and peace.

The Grinch who stole Christmas did steal all the Christmas presents. But Christmas came just the same. He then came to realize that Christmas is more than just presents and tinsel, and "his heart grew three sizes larger." May our hearts grow steadily during this special season as we wait quietly with Mary and John the Baptist for the birth of our Savior.

Or do the following:

- 1. Go to FORMED.ORG.
- 2. If you have used FORMED, select SIGN IN.
- 3. Otherwise, select FORMED FOR PARISHES.
- 4. Select SIGN UP in the top menu bar.
- 5. In "Find Your Parish or Organization", type "67671" (as the parish zip code).

- 7. Click NEXT.

If you did log out, you will need to provide your email address. FORMED will send you an email with a link to sign in. The link expires after 2 hours. Follow the steps to log back in.

Stewardship for Children Week 7

"As each one has received a gift, use it to serve one another as good stewards of God's varied grace." 1 Peter 4: 10

My Gift of Talent

<u>Stewardship is</u>: our belief that all we have and all we are comes from God. These are called gifts.

What are talents?

A talent is something you are really good at doing. It is a special blessing you have received. Most people have more than one talent. Sometimes it takes time, education, and hard work to help our talents grow.

READ Matthew 25:14-30, Jesus tells the "Parable of the Talents"

It doesn't matter how many talents you have — what matters is what you do with them!

Example of Talents:

A doctor uses his talents to help people get better.

Someone who likes to draw pictures can do so and mail or take to a friend who is not feeling well.
