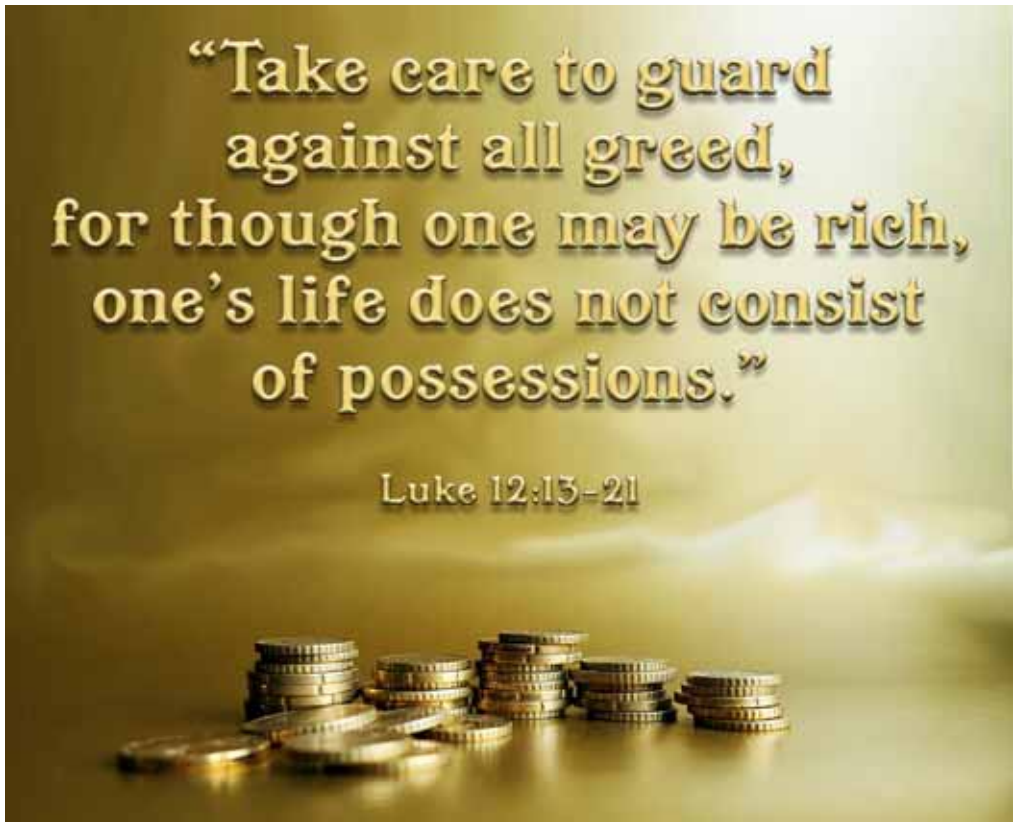

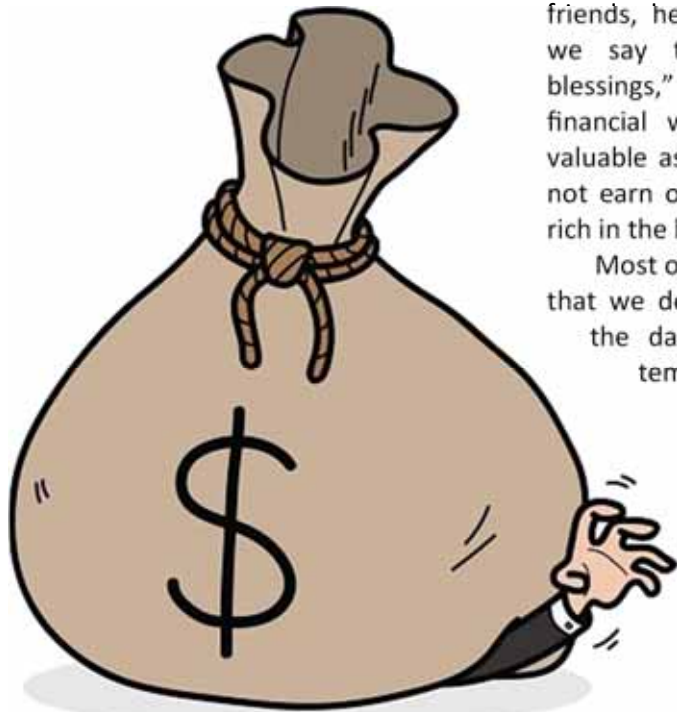

When many of us hear today's gospel warn about the danger of riches we breathe a sigh of relief. One thing we do not have to worry about is being rich! When the gospel denounces pride or envy or revenge it may sting my conscience, but when it warns about riches it is not talking to me. Let the rich people squirm today!

When the ancient philosopher Socrates was asked if he was rich he replied, "Compared to whom?" Are you rich? Compared to whom? Compared to those who dine in fine restaurants, or compared to those who must go hungry today? Compared to Wall Street investors who trade millions daily, or compared to Asian peasants who labor daily for pennies? Or simply compared to your ancestors, who worked long hours in the fields for

Aren't there already regulations on the abortion industry?
