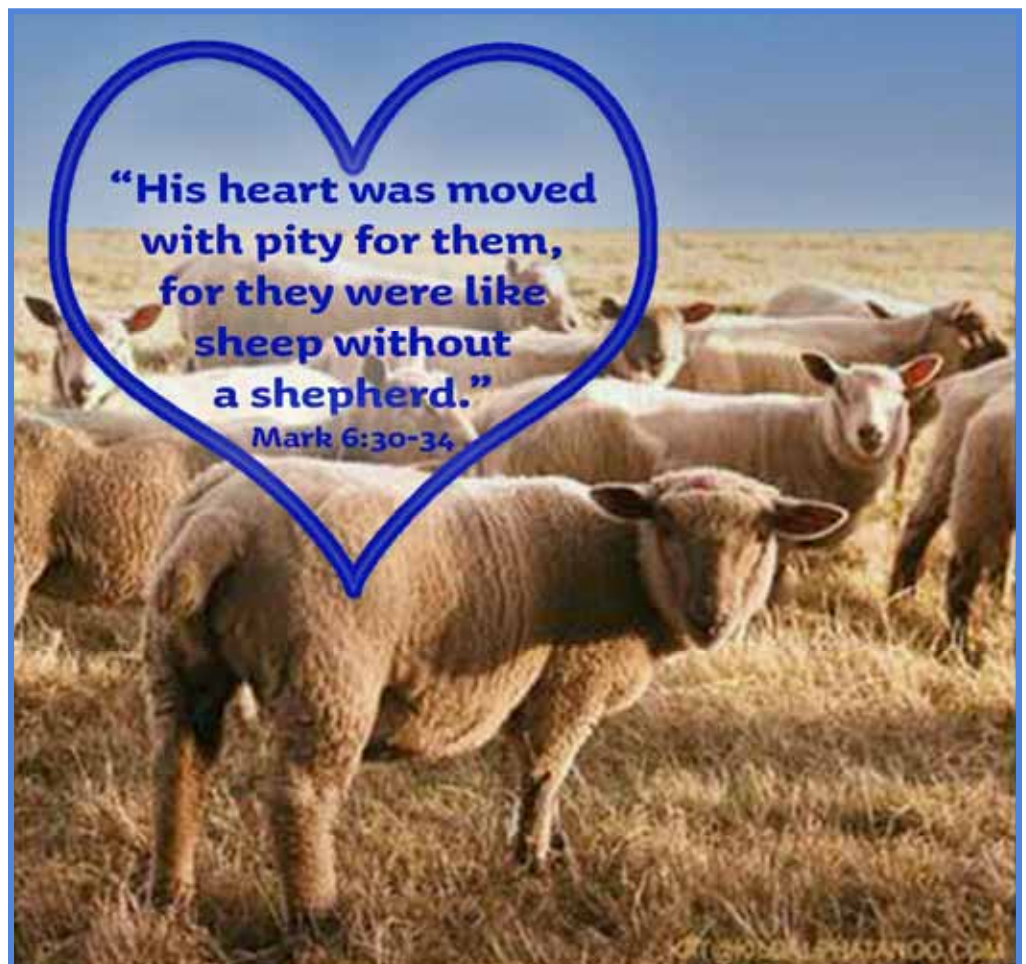

The Apostle to the Apostles

Tomorrow, July 22, is the feast of St. Mary Magdalene. After Mary, the mother of Christ, she is the most significant woman in the gospels. Although she is often defamed as a woman of ill-repute, the church rightly honors her as *The Apostle to the Apostles*.



We need to focus on what the gospels actually tell us about Mary Magdalene. After Jesus cast seven demons out of her (Mk 16:9, Lk 8:2), she became one of His followers. Those seven demons are unspecified; they might have been a physical illness, as many other demonic possessions in the gospels.

Mary Magdalene was among the women who accompanied Christ and ministered to Him (Lk 8:2-3), and among the women from Galilee who witnessed the crucifixion (Mk 15:40; Mt 27:56; Lk 23:49). In John's gospel she is at the foot of the cross (Jn 19:25). She is a witness to the burial of

Christ (Mt 27:61, Mk 15:47, Lk 23:55). In every gospel she is the first to the empty tomb on Easter. She is the first to whom the risen Christ appeared in Mark 16:1 and in John 20:1. She is sent by the Lord himself to tell the apostles that He is risen from the tomb. For this she is honored in tradition as *The Apostle to the Apostles*.

Unfortunately many have mistakenly held that Mary Magdalene was the sinful woman in Luke 7:36-50 who washed Jesus' feet and wiped them with her hair. This confusion may have come from the proximity of the two stories in the original text which did not have chapter divisions. Modern scripture scholars teach that the two stories are unrelated, and separate them by a chapter division.

These discussions should not distract from the most important encounter of Mary Magdalene with the Lord on Easter Sunday. "Mary stayed outside the tomb weeping. As she wept, she saw Jesus there, but did not know it was Jesus. Jesus said to her, 'Woman, why are you weeping? Whom are you looking for?' She thought it was the

gardener and said to him, 'Sir, if you carried him away, tell me where you laid him, and I will take him.' Jesus said to her, 'Mary!' She turned and said to him in Hebrew, 'Rabbouni,' which means Teacher. Jesus said to her, 'Stop holding on to me, for I have not yet ascended to the Father. But go to my brothers and tell them, 'I am going to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God.'"
