

The Paradox of Freedom

On this Fourth of July weekend we proudly celebrate our freedom. We should also reflect on the responsibilities of that freedom. Kansas editor, William Allen White wrote, "Liberty is the one thing you cannot have unless you give it to others." George Bernard Shaw wrote, "Liberty means responsibility."

Freedom is something of a paradox. Saint Peter and Saint Paul boasted that they were slaves of Christ. Yet both tell us that they were free in the truth of Christ. The most insightful instruction on freedom is the counsel of Christ to his disciples: "If you remain my word, you will truly be my disciples, and you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free." (Jn 8:32)

Truth offers freedom, yet truth can be very demanding. Freedom can be paradoxical. We are bound by the ten commandments which say repeatedly, "Thou shalt not." Yet when we follow them we have the freedom of the children of God. Those ten commandments are the Magna Carta of human freedom. The key to this paradox, the perfection of freedom, is to freely choose the right thing.

Any pretense of freedom as an absence of all restraint is a pseudo freedom, a slavery in disguise. To choose to do the wrong thing is not freedom but a slippery path to the slavery of evil. It is an invitation to addiction, which destroys liberty. Alcoholics and drug addicts know this paradox only too well. If I have to have it, I am no longer free. One measure of freedom is the number of things we

can walk away from.


An addiction is not an excuse for indulging in wrong behavior. Scripture says, "Live as free people, yet do not use your freedom as an excuse for evil." (1Pt 2:16) God's grace is offered to free us of our evil inclinations, but the ball is in our court since we must cooperate with God's grace to make it effective.

The salvation offered by Christ is the spiritual freedom from the enslavement of sin. Such freedom is not only heavenly peace, but also peace on earth. The truth of Christ sets us free by showing us that the correct use of freedom is to do the right thing freely.

The Saints were not only holy, they were also happy. They were happy because they were truly free. Paradoxically, being bound by the teachings of Christ freed them from their weaknesses. The gospel inspired them to freely choose a life of virtue. Theirs was the freedom of the children of God.





SAFE ENVIRONMENT PROGRAM



DIocese OF SALINA

All those who minister to children or young people on a regular basis are to be educated about the nature of child sexual abuse, how to report it, and strategies for prevention. The Diocese of Salina currently uses a program called CMGCONNECT, a web-based, on-line training program (along with an integrated background check) that specializes in helping churches, schools, and religious organizations create safe environments for children and youth. High School students in grades 9-12 who work with other minors on a regular basis will do their own training through CMGConnect, which covers safe and appropriate ways to interact with other children.

BEFORE beginning any ministry with children in your parish or school, you must have Safe Environment Training and it must be current (taken within the last 5 years).
