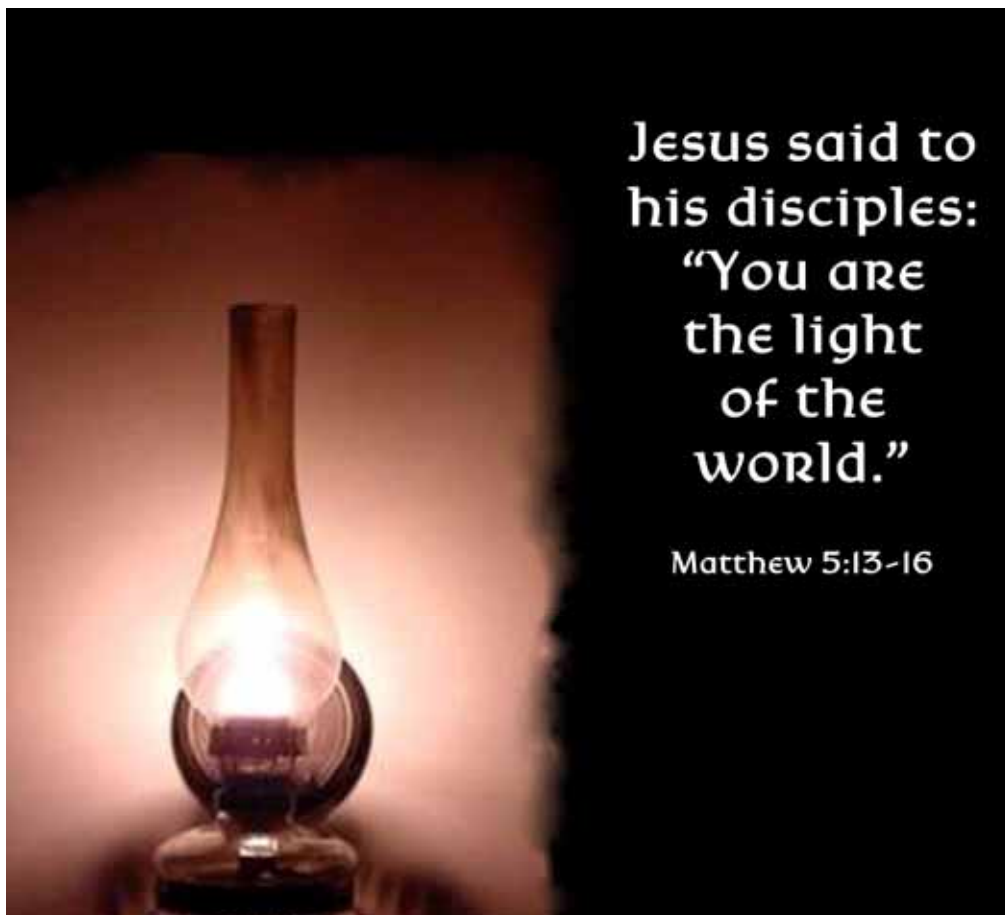

The Power of Example

"I can't hear what you're saying because your actions are shouting so loudly." That adage expresses well the message of today's gospel: we are to give good example, and we are accountable for our bad example.



"You are the light of the world. You are the salt of the earth. But if salt loses its taste, with what can it be seasoned." There is a mutual dynamic of behavior in the community of faithful Christians. The modern culture thinks differently: "I do my thing and you do your thing. You live as you want to live; I will live as I want to live."

Christianity has never endorsed such a philosophy. Christianity is a community faith. St. Augustine said, "One Christian is no Christian." The behavior of each Christian affects the entire community — for good or ill. Few of us will deny that the example of our elders is well remembered and has impacted our lives, for good or ill.

The prevailing attitude of our individualistic society, which denies the benefit of good example and scoffs at the danger of bad example, can unfortunately creep into the thinking of even good faithful Christians. It

often seems that the only interest others have in our behavior is fodder for gossip.

Many elderly feel that the younger generation has dismissed them. And it may often seem that way. But grandma and grandpa might be surprised how the fidelity of their lives has impressed the young and how often they are quoted. School children regularly say things like, "My grandma goes to church every day." "My grandpa says 'always tell the truth.'" "My aunt prays her rosary every day."

Of course the contrary is also observed by the keen eyes and ears of the young. "My uncle doesn't go to church." "My grandpa cusses." "My aunt likes to gossip."

Children are by nature curious and alert. Our enduring message to children is not so much our words but our deeds. Ultimately, "faith is caught not taught." Fidelity to one's faith, Sunday after Sunday, day in and day out, is an enduring message that no one can ignore, including rebellious teenagers, despite their protests to the contrary. A vital and sincere faith will be transmitted to the coming generation.

"You are the light of the world. A light is set on a lamp stand to give light to all in the house. Your light must shine before others that they may see your good deeds and glorify your heavenly Father."
