

28 Sept 2025 26 Ordinary Sunday

[Many of you heard this homily last week, but I offer it again here for further reflection.]

The Gospel today is about death/heaven/hell. So I offer you an overview of Church teaching.

It is normal to have a fear of death, but for Christians it is in the context of hope. Death puts an end to human life. Each of us will be rewarded immediately after death in accordance with our faith and virtue, or the lack of faith and virtue.

Those who die in God's grace and friendship, and are perfectly purified, live forever with Christ in the blessedness of heaven. Heaven is the ultimate fulfillment of the deepest human longings; the state of supreme and eternal happiness.

All who die in God's grace and friendship, but are still *imperfectly purified*, are assured eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification in Purgatory. This way, they achieve the full holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven.

We cannot be united with God unless we freely choose to love him. But we cannot love God if we live in serious sin. As an example, in today's Gospel, Jesus warns us that we will be separated from him if we fail in charity to others, especially regarding the needs of the Sick and Poor. To die in mortal sin, without repenting and accepting God's merciful love, means remaining separated from God forever by our own free choice.

This state of final self-exclusion from communion with God is called "hell." The idea of hell is sobering, serving as a powerful reminder of the seriousness of our moral choices, and the potential consequences of turning away from God's truth. God does not send anyone to hell. Our willful, persistent turning away from God in mortal sin is what directs us to hell. The chief punishment of hell is eternal separation from God, in whom alone we can possess the life and happiness for which we were created and for which we long.

By virtue of the "communion of saints," the Church commends the dead to God's mercy and offers prayers on their behalf, especially in the sacrifice of the Mass. The Church prays that no one will be lost.

Since we know neither the day nor the hour of our death, we should follow the advice of Jesus and constantly live lives of charity/faith/virtue, so that, when the course of our earthly life is done, we may be ready to enter heaven.

Meanwhile, we need not live in fear. Christ wants us to be with Him forever. Christ is faithful and constant in shepherding us. God's love is stronger than death.

HELP US PRESERVE THE INTEGRITY OF OUR CHURCH

The exterior of our beloved church is in need of repair. This restoration project will help preserve the structure and beauty of our church for generations to come.

Mid-Continental Restoration Co., Inc. will be completing this work. The scope of the project includes:

Sealant Application to Vertical Joints in Stone Caps & Bands

All vertical head joints between coping stones and stone bands will be cut back and cleaned of any loose or foreign debris. These joints will then be resealed with new sealant, tooled to a neat and uniform appearance, and color-matched as closely as possible to the existing material.

Tuckpointing Stone Mortar Joints

All mortar joints will be carefully inspected. Any that are found to be void, open, or defective will be repaired. All affected areas will be cleaned to remove any loose residue, and defective joints will be repointed using a non-staining, non-shrinking Type "N" masonry mortar. This mortar will be colormatched and tooled to blend seamlessly with the surrounding joints.

The total estimated cost for this vital work is \$109,980. We are asking for your generosity in helping us raise the necessary funds to complete these repairs. No amount is too small, and all donations are deeply appreciated. You can donate by dropping off at the Parish Office or by placing in the collection basket in a separate envelope labeled "Building Repairs".
