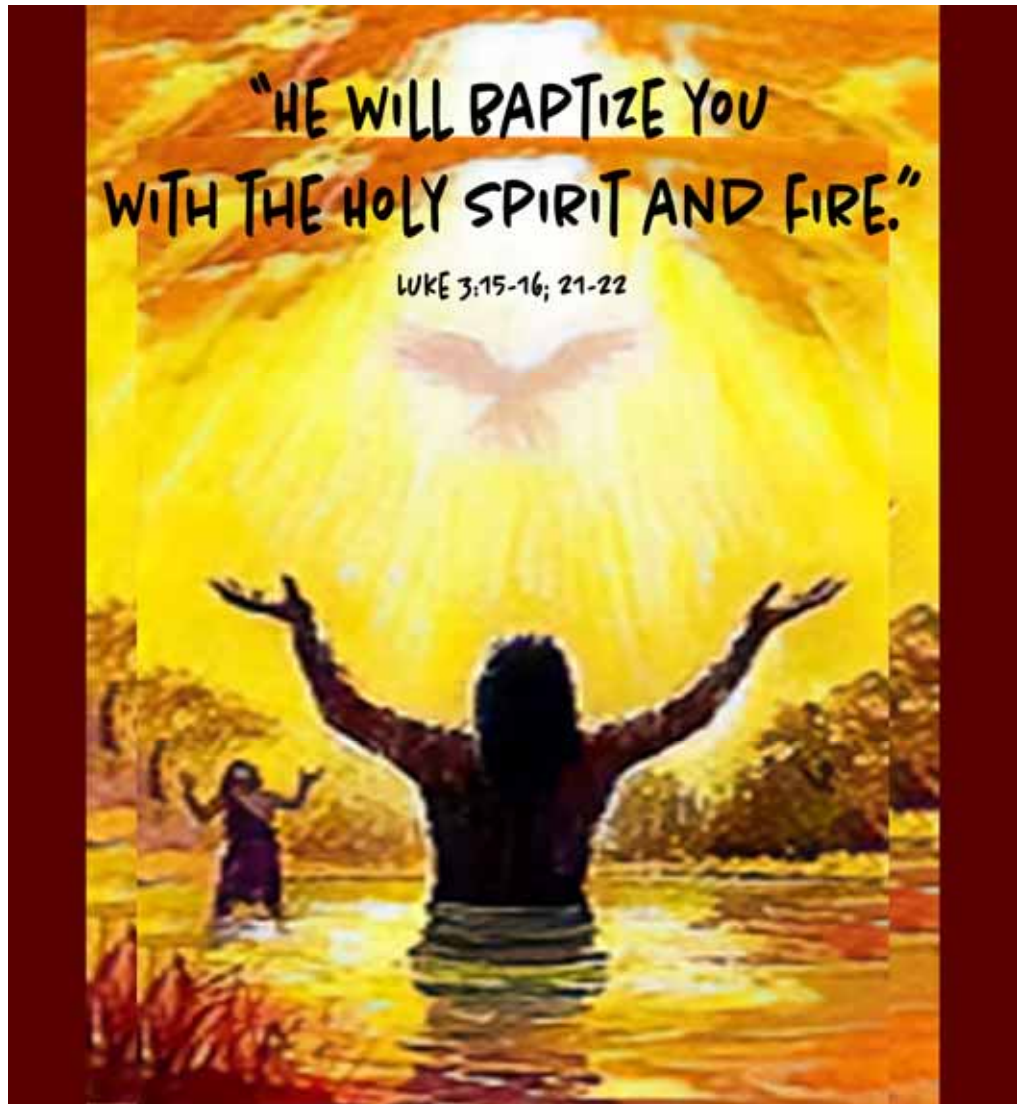

Baptizing Sinners and the Sinless

Today's feast of the Baptism of the Lord can be confusing. John the Baptist proclaimed "a baptism for the forgiveness of sins," and the sinless Jesus stepped forward to be baptized. The baptism that John preached and the sacramental baptism of our Christian faith must be quite different.

The Catholic Catechism says of the baptism of Christ by John: "Our Lord voluntarily submitted himself to the baptism of John, intended for sinners, in order to 'fulfill all righteousness.' The Spirit who had hovered over the waters at the first creation in Genesis descended then on Christ, the new creation, the beloved Son of the Father."

Of our own sacramental baptism it says: "Baptism is the basis of the whole Christian life, the gateway to life in the Spirit, and the door which gives access to the other sacraments. Through Baptism we are freed from sin and reborn as children of God; we become members of Christ's Church and made sharers in her mission."

The baptism of Christ by John and our baptism are clearly not the same, yet related. John's baptism did not free Christ of any sin, yet it is related to our sinful condition, which Christ identified

with at the incarnation and reaffirmed at that baptism.

When Christ was baptized the voice of God the Father proclaimed, "This is my beloved Son." Jesus is the Son of God, sent by the Father for our salvation. His baptism is the public proclamation that Jesus was anointed by the Father to save us from our sins.

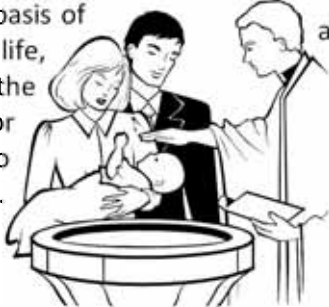
Jesus went into the waters of the Jordan River to inaugurate his public ministry by stepping into the place of sinners to redeem them. By assuming our human nature he identified with sinful humanity so that, as one of us, his death and resurrection might offer us a share in his divine life.

To clarify this dilemma of the baptism of the sinless Christ and its relationship to our own sacramental baptism, it is helpful to reflect on the baptism of innocent infants. They are not baptized to free them from their present sins, but to incorporate them into the church, the body of Christ, which has been redeemed and through which their future sins may be forgiven.

We celebrate the Baptism of the Lord because it is an image of Christ identifying with our sinful human condition that through his death and resurrection we, who have been identified with him by our own sacramental baptism, are offered a share in his eternal life.

This directory will be for all three parishes so anyone can help or be in charge.

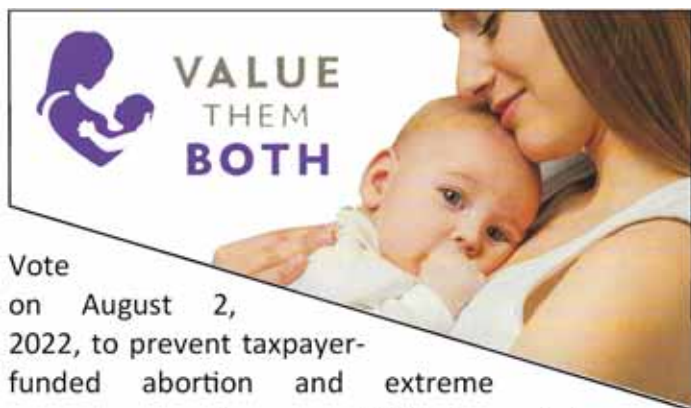

SAFE ENVIRONMENT PROGRAM



DIocese OF SALINA

All those who minister to children or young people on a regular basis are to be educated about the nature of child sexual abuse, how to report it, and strategies for prevention.

The Diocese of Salina currently uses a program called CMGCONNECT, a web-based, on-line training program (along with an integrated background check) that specializes in helping churches, schools, and religious organizations create safe environments for children and youth. High School students in grades 9-12 who work with other minors on a regular basis will do their own training through CMGConnect, which covers safe and appropriate ways to interact with other children.

BEFORE beginning any ministry with children in your parish or school, you must have Safe Environment Training and it must be current (taken within the last 5 years).
