God and Neighbor

Some of the great discoveries of science have not been finding something new but finding the connection between two things already known. That is also true of the insights of scripture, and today's gospel is a prime example.

Christ knew not only the priority among the Old Testament laws but also, what others had failed to see, the connection between them. The lawyer asked Christ which was the first of the commandments. Christ gave him the first, *and* the second. The lawyer had asked only for the first. Christ made it clear that you cannot understand one without the other. The first commandment, love of God, does not stand alone. Love of God and love of neighbor are inseparable, two parts of one law. Love of God must express itself in love of neighbor, and in loving our neighbor we express our love of God.

St. John stated this boldly, "If anyone says, 'I love God,' but hates his neighbor, he is a liar. One who does not love the neighbor he has seen, cannot love the God he has not seen." (1Jn 4:20) In blunt terms, the way we treat other people is a mirror of the way we treat God. None of us wants to hear that.

Most of us have a few strained relationships, perhaps a disgruntled neighbor, a distant spouse, a difficult child. But we imagine that we have a warm, comforting,

secure relationship with God. We may not get along with certain people. But surely, we get along with God. Other people do not understand me. God understands me. Baloney!

It is easy to fantasize about our relationship with God. For example, God would never talk to me the way other people do. Yet in His mysterious wisdom God has chosen not to speak to us directly, but through others. Perhaps some of God's mercy and compassion may be lost in the translation, but when your spouse tells you that your are inconsiderate, or your parents tell you that you are insubordinate, or your neighbor tells you that you are inhospitable, those just might be the voices that God is using to remind you of how you are treating others, and therefore Himself.

Christ saw the bond between biblical laws which many, then and now, fail to notice. The two great commandments, which are so comforting, tell us this very uncomfortable truth: how we love the people we live with each day is a mirror of how we love God. Ouch!
