The Sacred Triduum

Holy Week is the commemoration of the passion of Christ beginning with his triumphant entry into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday. The celebration of the final three days of Holy Week — Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Holy Saturday Easter Vigil — are known as the Sacred Triduum.

Holy Thursday is the celebration of the Lord's Supper, popularly known as the Last Supper, when the sacraments of Eucharist and priesthood were instituted by Christ. The celebration features the washing of feet, symbolic of the new commandant of love in service to others.

Good Friday commemorates the crucifixion of Christ with the veneration of the cross. The reading of the Passion of the Lord is from the gospel of John which focuses on the positive meaning of the death of Christ, his triumph over evil and sin, hence Good Friday.

The Easter Vigil, the principal liturgical celebration of the year, recalls the Resurrection of Christ with symbols of fire and light and water. The Easter Candle, Christ our Light, dispels the darkness of sin and death, and a new life of grace is offered in the waters of baptism.

Christianity is based on historical events. But our observance of Holy Week is more than a remembrance or a reenactment of those stories. Holy Week celebrates the message, the meaning, and the metanoia — the change of heart which those stories can evoke.

The church celebrates not simply the history but the unseen reality behind those visible events, the spiritual design of God acting in the world, a pattern to be lived anew in our own lives. The foundation of our faith is the Paschal Mystery, the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. It is not only the cornerstone of the Christian faith, but the template of the life of all the baptized. That is what we proclaim during Holy Week.

We remember what once happened to Jesus of Nazareth to help us focus on what should happen to us now. We are to be a people of faith, called to conversion, and animated with his grace for charity. We celebrate God's presence in our hearts, sustaining us as a faith community, rich in compassion, steadfast in hope, and committed to peace and justice in our world.

If you want to know what we believe as Christians and Catholics it is in the Sacred Triduum. If you want to understand the meaning of the life and death of Jesus Christ, it is in the Sacred Triduum. If you want to renew your faith, it is in celebrating the Sacred Triduum.

New St. Fidelis Cemetery Entrance Completed



Back in July of 2023 work was begun to replace the deteriorating parts of the St. Fidelis Cemetery gate entrance. As Kenny Pfeifer and Wilmer Dinkel were working on the gate, they found parts that were rusted and falling apart. Different sized bolts and lots of wire were used to keep the lettering and wrought iron designs in place. Thus began the journey to redo the gate using some of the elements from the original and creating new ones.

Kenny Pfeifer used the scroll work from the old fence when designing the new gate, flipping the scrolls horizontally. He also used the crosses from the old fence and the angel plates that were on the walk-in gates.

The 1976 "Towers of Faith and Courage" souvenir book and the "Chronicles of the Capuchins" mention that Heinrich Schumacher donated an iron gate for the cemetery, but there are conflicting dates as to when: the first appears to say it was donated in 1913; the second says 1915. Apparently, the gate was made elsewhere because the Chronicles mention freight cost \$82.

There were many mentions in the history file of

putting up or repairing fencing at the cemetery throughout the years, put whether another front entrance gate was installed is not clear. In October 1991, Parish Council minutes noted that a letter "i" in Fidelis was missing on the main gate.

There are once again conflicting dates as to when the current cemetery location was purchased. One source ("The Early Years of the Province 1873-1907") mentions that it was purchased in 1885 and blessed by Bishop Scannell on October 20 of that year. The remains of Father Matthew, the first pastor and superior of Victoria, were transferred to the new cemetery around that time.

Another source ("Chronicles of the Capuchins") gives the date of purchase as 1888 and the blessing from Bishop Scannel was in October of 1889. At the same time, he also blessed the original convent which was completed that year. (The current convent was completed in 1949 at a cost of \$95,700.) The Chronicles said 5 acres were bought from Michael Quint for \$30. Half of the new acreage was laid out in lots measuring 16 feet and 20 feet and were sold from \$14 to \$18 a piece.

Previous St. Fidelis Cemetery Entrance



The original cemetery lies west of where the current cemetery is now located. It contains one monument listing the names of those who were buried there. According to the 1986 Golden Jubilee souvenir booklet celebrating the 75th anniversary of the building of our current St. Fidelis Church, the old cemetery was used from 1879 until 1889.

By January 1924, the price of lots ran \$24 to \$30. The Parish Council pronounced the cemetery to be "in first class condition" after the fence was painted and "the entrance made good and solid with a new wooden culvert underneath." Nine years later, Council minutes for January 1933 mention the

price of a lot was fixed at \$14 and \$28. And again in 1937, the price of a lot was altered to be \$25. By 1944, it was announced in Pulpit News that the cemetery "has been in a deplorable condition for years." (They just couldn't seem to win for losing!)

Along the way, land on the north, east, and south side of the cemetery was either donated or purchased to enlarge the cemetery property to the size it is today. With the addition of the land, a road around the cemetery was constructed and parking problems at the cemetery during funerals was alleviated.
