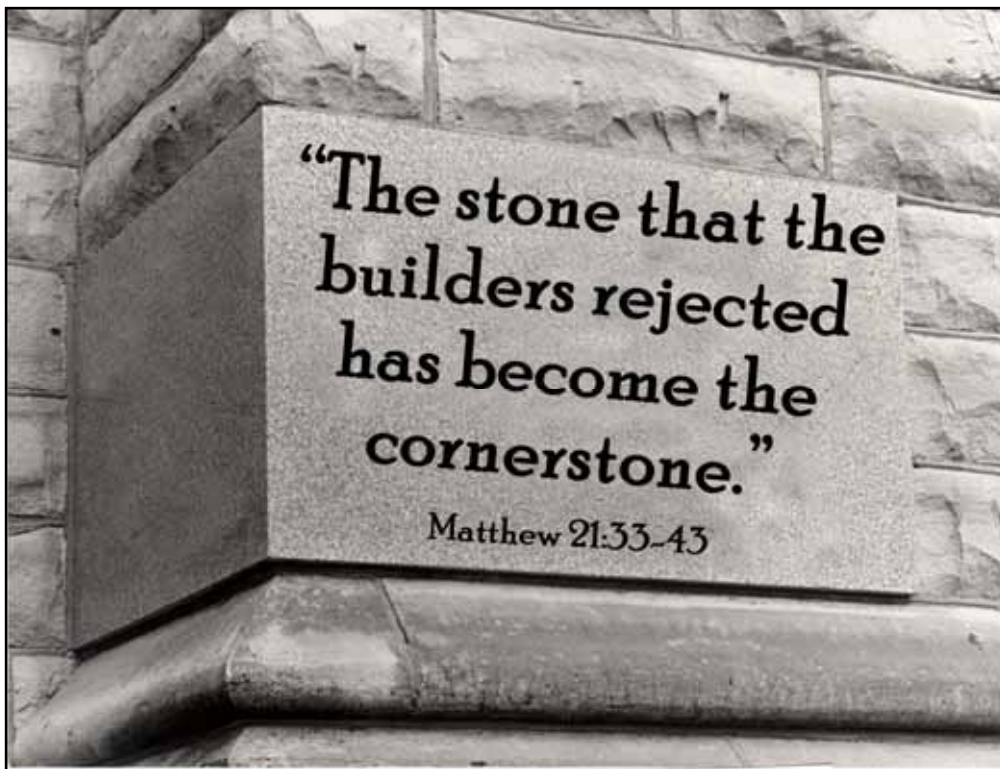

The Keystones of Faith

We all know the experience of wanting something that we have discarded. Perhaps it was a handy tool, a home appliance, a holiday keepsake. It was so easy to throw away, so difficult to replace. Today's gospel reminds us, "The stone which the builders rejected has become the keystone of the structure."

A keystone is the crowning support stone of an arch. Without a keystone, the arch will collapse. In today's gospel parable, when the tenant farmers rejected the landlord's son they lost their only hope of sharing in the harvest. Christ is the keystone of our faith. Those who reject Him reject their own salvation.

This gospel image has Old Testament roots in Joseph, the favorite of Jacob's twelve sons. Joseph is a symbol, a pre-figure of Christ. Joseph was abandoned and sold into slavery by his traitorous brothers but later it was Joseph who saved those same brothers in time of famine. "The stone which the builders rejected has become the keystone of the structure."

This parable in today's gospel was directed to the Pharisees who rejected Christ. But there is also an enduring message for our age. Modern Christians can feel at times that some teachings of their faith, or traditional devotions, are outdated. So they abandon them as irrelevant, or childish, even medieval. But later they realize that what they have discarded is precisely what they need.

For example, some may discontinue daily prayers thinking that such prayers are for children. When their spiritual well runs dry, they realize their need for daily communion with God. The same might be said for those who have discontinued Lenten observance, the rosary, scripture reading, or even Sunday Mass. Only too late do we realize our need for spiritual practices we have discarded.



This can even lead to a rebellion against faith itself. When life is burdensome and our prayers are not answered, we get angry at God and indulge in foolish thoughts: "Why pray? It doesn't do any

good." "Church is a waste of time." Naively, we think that we are punishing God! In fact, we are only hurting ourselves.

Any time we try to punish the object of our anger, we are really punishing ourselves. When we neglect the practice of our faith, we starve our inner spirit. When we dismiss the doctrines of our faith we dismantle the foundation of our life. Eventually we will be searching for the very things we have discarded. "The stone which the builders rejected has become the keystone of the structure."

Until 1908, the Church in the United States was a mission territory. We relied on this fund to build our churches and seminaries and support our clergy and religious. Today many foreign missions rely on our generosity to sustain the Church, which is an instrument of God's love and mercy, His hope and peace.
